Gold Competition:

Owners and lessees are required to hold a sport license equivalent to the level at which the rider and horse are competing. The owner must hold a license equivalent to the level at which his/her horse is competing, regardless of whether he/she is riding the horse in competition. In the event that an owner or rider does not have a sport license a one-time license upgrade – single event may be purchased. In order to do this riders, owners, or coaches must hold at minimum a Bronze Sport Licence (exceptions only in A213). The single event upgrades are available for purchase directly through the competitors MyEC portal. There is a flat rate of \$50 per upgrade, regardless of levels being upgraded. Upgrades are not available for Platinum. ALL sales of temporary licences require competitors to acknowledge they are not eligible for points at the competition.

JUMP CANADA LEVY A \$20 levy will be collected for every horse entered in a Jumping Gold Level tournament. This levy will be used to support several regional and national programs designed to foster the activities of Hunter/Jumper riders, owners, and the industry at large. JUMP ALBERTA LEVY Blue Sky Classic Horse Show continues to support all levels of the sport in the province of Alberta. Competitors who reside in the province of Alberta and are participating at any JA tournaments are required to be a member of our provincial association to compete. All competitors that reside in Alberta are required to pay a levy fee of \$10 at gold competition. This fee helps to fund horse & rider development programs that will directly benefit Alberta athletes. Equestrian Canada Horse Recording/Passport required for horse or temporary horse registration can be purchased in the show office. Jump Alberta Membership is also required.

In the event a competitor does not have a passport/valid horse recording for their horse a temporary horse registration may be purchased from the show office for \$79.00. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. Direct all questions regarding rules and regulations to the steward.

Wild Rose Competition:

Do not require EC Sport Licenses for the rider nor EC Horse Recordings. The rider does require AEF (or other Provincial) membership. All competitors that reside in Alberta are required to pay a Jump Alberta levy fee of \$5 at Wildrose competition.

All horses attending Equestrian Canada / sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations." "Per Article A801, every entry at an ECsanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition..." (A602.7)

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

- EC is committed to:
- Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care
 professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety as a
 matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.
- Requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition.
- Reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.
- The standard by which conduct, or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

HUNTER HUNT AND HANDY DERBY

'Hunt & Handy' format will consist of two phases. Classic hunter phase consisting of 7-8 fences with a maximum of four high options. Handy hunter phase consisting of 5-8 fences with a maximum of four high options. Pace, brilliance, and use of shorter tracks are to be rewarded in the handy phase. Both phases will be jumped consecutively with no break in pace. All participants will complete all phases even if minor penalties (rails, refusals, etc.) are incurred. Major penalties (falls, two refusals, of course, etc.) will result in elimination. Scores plus bonus points will be given for each phase. Horse may only compete in one height section. Riders may ride multiple horses. Non-pro riders may cross enter between height sections, but horses may not.

For all medals: there are no minimum requirements to fill classes. An open numerical scoring system will be used in the first round with each riders score announced at the completion of their round. The top four competitors will be tested. Riders to return in the same tack. Only one horse per rider and the same horse must be used in all phases.

A Jump Alberta Membership is required to compete in this class. Fences as per EC heights. Smalls jump 2'3, mediums jump 2'6, and larges jump 2'9. Open to junior riders on ponies who are not competing in the same show in any hunter or equitation class in which the fences exceed 3'3. No cross entry in the children's medal at the same show.

All contestants or a minimum of eight shall be called back to perform at a walk, trot and canter. From a minimum of four of the contestants, the judge is required to call for a minimum of two or more requirements from Article G1009, Tests. No change of tack between phases. Three entries are required to run the class. If less than 3 complete the class, see G1105.4 for special rules. Riders may not cross enter into a 3'0" medal class at the same competition.

GENERAL INFORMATION JUMPER CLASSES

Jumpers will be scored under Alternate Table A (FEI Article 238). Ties for 1st place will be jumped off. For ties other than 1st place, money will be added together and divided equally; riders will toss a coin for ribbons. A computer draw is established daily for jumpers. Horses may be required to jump in posted order. Exhibitors riding more than one horse in any class if not listed on the entry form (i.e., catch rider) must inform the Horse Show Office one-hour before the class so that their rides may be spaced. At no time will the gate be held for more than five minutes due to rider trainer conflicts. Jump-off to be ridden over a shortened course. Some fences may be raised by 3". All jumpers should be prepared to jump off immediately if clean.

Jumper Division may include – Optimum Time, Speed, and Power and Speed. All classes run under EC National Rule: FEI Art 236: elimination after two refusals in all jumper rings.

Nominated Rings

Horses entered in the Gold Grand Prix Ring pay a nomination fee of \$120. Horses entered in Wildrose Jumper Ring #2 will pay a nomination fee of \$80. Nomination fees allow jumpers in each of these rings to move from classes and/or divisions without an add/scratch fee.

Jumper Nominating Fee Refund Policy

Jumper nomination fee refund schedule will be as follows: before the closing date of entries -100%, after the closing date, but before the start of the show -50%. After the show starts there will be no refunds. No refund on stabling after closing date of entries May 1/2024

GENERAL RULES AND OTHER INFORMATION

- 1. The Blue Sky Classic competition is a sanctioned gold competition member of: equestrian Canada, 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ont. K1H 7X7 and is governed by the rules of equestrian Canada. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of equestrian Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with the equestrian Canada rule Book. Horse record and EC memberships are required.
- 2. The management reserves the right to cancel or combine any class not filled to satisfaction; whereupon exhibitors will be notified as soon as possible after close of entries.
- 3. Inhumane treatment of a horse will not be tolerated. Violation of this rule, at the discretion of the organization committee, will result in disqualification and forfeiture of fees, all winnings and loss of entry.
- 4. Numbers must be always worn and visible in the schooling and/or exercise areas as well as in the competition ring. (A 814) Any exhibitor using a wrong number, or having no number, may be excused or disqualified from the class, at the judge's discretion.
- 5. Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, handler, or rider, will disqualify the horse, and result in forfeiture of entry fees for subsequent classes. Management reserves the right to remove a groom, handler/rider and/or horse from the show, without being liable for compensation.
- 6. No judge shall be approached with regards to any decision during the time he is judging or is about to judge. Penalty will be disqualification from the show in its entirety.
- 7. The medical aid fee covers the cost of medical aid on site. The fee does not cover personal expenses incurred by the injured party in the event of an injury or transportation by ambulance.
- 8. No person other than officials, staff on duty, and the judges of the classes may enter the competition rings without permission of the tournament management. Competitors are allowed in the competition rings only when competing, when the course is open for walking or during scheduled schooling rounds.
- 9. Dogs must always be on a leash. For safety and sanitary reasons, no dogs will be permitted in the schooling area, show rings, or show office.
- 10. Courses will be posted in the hitching ring one half-hour prior to the start of each class.

HARD HATS AND ATTIRE

- 1. All competitors, including foreign competitors, must wear ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) or BSI approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, always while mounted on the competition grounds.
- 2. Juniors showing any horse in a jog for soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened.
- 3. Failure to comply with points 1 and 2 above in the exercise area and/or the competition arena will result in the following penalties:
 - a) 1st violation at competition: warning
 - b) 2nd violation at same competition: disqualification from the competition and forfeiture of all fees and prize monies
- 4. All competitors must be properly dressed in the confines of the arena. This includes the inspection of the course and at the presentation of prizes. Hunter rings braiding and hunt jackets at all times. Jumper rings (Friday) collared shirts (i.e. polo shirts) are allowed.

NON-SHOWING FEE

There will be a non-showing fee of \$100 for horses not entered in any competitions at the tournament. The non-showing fee allows use of the warm-up rings and other grounds as well as access to the rings on warm-up day. All non-showing horses are required to sign an entry waiver and wear a number while on the grounds.

HORS CONCOURS

Hors Concours Pertaining to Jumpers -Article G501

- 1. Horses shall be allowed to compete "Hors Concours" with permission from the organizing committee but are subject to the same scoring rules as a regular entry with respect to falls, elimination etc. Such entries are not judged and are not eligible for the jump off.
- 2. A horse or pony that has competed "Hors Concours" is not allowed to compete subsequently in the same ring on the same day.
- 3. "Hors Concours" entries will follow the last regular entry in the class.
- 4. "Hors Concours" entries are not allowed in Hunter Divisions, Equitation and Medal classes

ENTRIES

- 1. Entries for the Blue Sky Classic must use the Blue Sky Classic entry form for appropriate level, Wildrose or EC Gold by May 1, 2024.
- 2. Entry forms must be accompanied by a \$250 deposit to cover entry fees, offices fees, stabling fees and any other applicable fees. This must be paid through etransfer.
- 3. NSF cheques will result in an additional \$60 service fee.
- 4. Credit card transactions are subject to a 3% processing fee. Declined cards are subject to a \$150 penalty. Physical credit card **must** be present at time of checkout or a \$50 processing fee will be charged for manual entry.
- 5. Competitors are responsible for their own errors or those of their agents in preparation of their entry forms. Juniors must have a parent or guardian sign their entry form.
- 6. Entries received after the closing date will be subject to a \$100 late fee.
- 7. Postdated cheques or payment received after the closing date will be required to pay the late fee.
- 8. The management reserves the right to limit entries in any division and to refuse or decline any entry without being liable for compensation or damages.
- 9. Changes may be made Thursday afternoon and Friday for no penalty. Changes after Friday will be assessed a \$25.00 change fee.
- 10. Jumpers must pay a jump nominating fee of \$120 for Jumper ring # 1 or \$80 for Jumper ring # 2. Only one nominating fee will be charged per horse.
- 11. When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See rules of equestrian Canada, Section a, general regulations, article 102, Safe Sport environments.

REFUNDS

- 1.Exhibitors cancelling their entries after the official closing date, but prior to the start of the show shall, upon presentation of a valid veterinary certificate, forfeit their stall, tack room and administration fees, but will be refunded levy fees and 50% of all other fees. After the closing date non-veterinarian scratches will not be refunded. Substitutions will be permitted, prior to the start of the show, for a fee of \$25.00.
- 2. Trainers Splits: Trainers requiring barn bills for shavings or hay should set them up at the beginning of the tournament with an open cheque or a credit card number. Trainer's splits must be done no later than Sunday at 12:00pm.

HORSE RECORDING/ MEMBERSHIPS (Gold)

- 1. Equestrian Canada Horse Recording/ Passports are mandatory for all horses and ponies entered in the Blue Sky Classic Horse Show. Canadian horses competing in an EC Gold show are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording Annual Activation Fee to compete, a temporary Horse Registration may be purchased from the show office for \$79.00. Horse Recording number is the control number used by EC and must be included on the entry. Horses must be entered under the name appearing on the Horse recording. (Note: Horses that formerly held EC Passports will carry the same number forward to their Horse Recording.)
- 2. All riders and owners must have an individual gold sport license in Equestrian Canada or be bona fide members of their own National Equestrian Federations. Rider and owner membership numbers must be submitted with entries. If no memberships are shown a Bronze license and a one-time single event upgrade can be purchase through the EC rider portal (\$50). Riders and Owners (for insurance purposes) must be a member is good standing with Equestrian Canada. Numbers will not be issued to anyone not in good standing.

MEMBERSHIPS (Wildrose)

1 Riders and owners must be Alberta Equestrian Members.

DRUG FEES AND INSPECTION (Gold)

Competitors will be assessed a fee of \$20 for the Jump Canada Levy, \$8 for drug fees, and \$10 for the Jump Alberta Levy. Any horse entered in any class at a competition, while on the competition grounds be selected for equine medication control testing at the event location. (A602.5)

STABLING

- 1. Stabling is available at Amberlea Meadows for all competitors at a rate of \$250.00 + GST for the duration of the show (A603D). Hauling in for the day is permitted for a fee of \$60 per day or \$150 for the show. Day stall may be purchased for \$85.00/day.
- 2. Feed and bedding must be pre-ordered as there will be limited bedding or feed deliveries during show. Competitors are required to pre-order bedding on entry form.
- 3. Trainers wishing to split the cost of tack stalls must indicate on the stall request form.
- 4. No horse will be placed in an unassigned stall without approval from management.
- 5. Stabling will be available from 12:00 pm May 16th and is available until May 21st, 2024.

TROPHIES, RIBBONS AND PRIZE MONEY

- 1. Ribbons will be given to sixth place in all classes except Medal Classes or unless otherwise specified. Mounted presentations will be required for horse/rider combinations on Sunday and Monday.
- 2. Prize money will be divided as follows unless otherwise specified:
 - a. First=28%, Second=24%, Third=19%, Fourth=14%, Fifth=10%, Sixth=5%
 - b. Jumper Classics and Hunter Classic will divide prize money as follows:
 - First=25%, Second=20%, Third=15%, Fourth=12%, Fifth=10%, Sixth=8%,
 - Seventh=5%, Eighth=5%
- 3. Points for championships shall be awarded on the following basis:1st (7 points), 2nd (5 points), 3rd (4 points), 4th (3 points), 5th (2 points), 6th (1 point).
- 4. Jumper Championship: The Champion and Reserve Champion titles shall be awarded to the two horses that have accumulated the most points performing over fences in the division in which they are being shown. In the case of a tie for the Champion/Reserve, the highest placing in the largest prize money class of the division will be used. If all classes have same prize money, the last class of the division will be used.
- 5. Hunter Championship: The Champion and Reserve Champion titles shall be awarded to the two that have accumulated the most points performing in the division in which they are being shown. In the case of a tie, the Championship and/or Reserve shall be awarded to the horse that has accumulated the most points over fences. In the event there is still a tie, the tied horses shall be shown at walk, trot, and canter to determine championship and reserve. Tossing a coin to break the tie is permissible if all participants agree. This competition shall be judged as an independent Hunter Under Saddle class with information, quality, substance, soundness and performance to count as prescribed throughout the appropriate division.

SCHOOLING ROUNDS

All EC-sanctioned competitions must use current FEI schooling rules as listed. (Annex 1) These rules pertain to all hunter, equitation and jumper classes and divisions at all EC sanctioned competitions. Hunter ring schooling rounds will be available (weather permitting) from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm on Friday, May 17. (Times may change slightly, subject to demand.) Schooling round times may be booked in blocks for stables. All competitors wishing to school must have a schooling pass. The horse must have its competitions number on. Pass price \$45.00 /horse for hunter ring #2 and \$30.00/round for hunter ring #1. Please call (780) 983-2616 or come to the show office to reserve a time slot.

PRIVATE PHOTOGRAPHER POLICY

Media passes are mandatory for all private (hired) photographers and are \$300 CAD per photographer, per horse show. This fee is to be paid in advance. Photographers are required to provide a client list and proof of Accident Liability Insurance prior to the start of the horse show.

RULES: 1. Official show photographer S.Capturing the Moment Photography, and all of their representatives will have priority positioning in and around all of the arenas. 2. Accredited photographers will be allowed inside the ring for awards on request. 3. Private (personal) photographers may not shoot, or place remote equipment, in the ring or alongside the ring without prior approval.

MEDIA: Photographers/videographers representing newspapers, magazines, websites, television, or other media with the purpose of appearing in online or print are exempt from the fee but must notify the show manager prior to shooting (and any products cannot be sold to third parties).

RV PARKING

Campers or motor homes are to be parked in the southwest parking lot by the arena, where plug-ins are available for \$200/ week + GST. No RVs with propane tanks will be allowed to park within 50 feet of any building to avoid potential fire risk. Showers are available for public use in the main barn area. A septic tank dumping station is also available for use. Please contact office 780-955-7608 to reserve your RV spot.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the province in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles if they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardians(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offence. Wheelchair and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

BIOSECURITY

Bio Security is everyone's responsibility. Blue Sky Classic Horse Show is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all exhibitors and their horses. All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. Travelling and showing horses are at an increased risk for spreading and contracting contagious diseases. All horses entering the show grounds must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 14 days. They must not exhibit any sign of illness. All horses coming on to the grounds must provide proof of valid Equine Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds). Horses exhibiting any signs of illness are not permitted on the grounds. Competitors are required to notify the tournament office at the first sign of illness or elevated temperature. Horses missing valid vaccinations will NOT be permitted on the grounds and entries are NOT eligible for a refund of fees. The name on the vaccination MUST MATCH the name on the entry to be acceptable. Please take the horses temperature 3 days prior to bringing them to the show grounds (this includes horses hauling in). Horses are not permitted to come on to the grounds if they are stabled at a facility where any horses have been at a venue with a confirmed case of EHV (neurologic or non-neurologic) or any other transmissible disease/ illness within the last 10 days. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds then continue to follow temperature checks twice daily while on the grounds. Please avoid direct and/or indirect contact between horses, especially nose-to-nose contact.

EQUINE VACCINATION RULE

"All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519.

All horses coming on to the grounds must provide proof of valid Equine Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds). Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave event site at the discretion of competition management. Please ensure you complete the following: With your entry: Provide Proof of vaccination. Prior to the show: Take your horses temperature 3 consecutive days prior to bringing them to the show grounds. At the show: All horses on the grounds must have their temperatures taken and recorded twice daily. Temperatures should be taken while your horse is in a relaxed state (so not immediately after exercise) and should be below 102F.

CONCUSSION ACCIDENTS & RETURN TO RIDE RULE

In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitors must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel onsite before continuing to compete. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place. Should a competitor refuse to be evaluated, they will be disqualified from the competition. If onsite qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion or believe the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor will be suspended from competition and placed on a Medical Suspension List until medically released. Competitors will remain on the EC Medical Suspension List until they submit an E Return to Play Form, signed by a licensed physician, to EC. No competitor shall compete at the EC sanctioned competitions while on the EC Medical Suspension List and competition organizers may refuse entry to anyone on the list.

LIABILITY WAIVER

This affects your legal rights and liabilities, please read carefully.

- 1. I am aware that the sport of horses, participating in the Blue Sky Classic horse show, and being around horses involves many risks, dangers and hazards and I am participating in the Blue Sky Classic Horse Show at my own risk and in full knowledge of the risks, dangers and hazards. I further acknowledge the risks, dangers and hazards in riding and working around horses, which risks, dangers and hazards include, but are not limited to, bodily injury to individuals who are around horses; and to both horse and rider which can result from normal use, competition, or schooling. It is hereby also understood that no helmet or protective equipment can protect against all foreseeable injury.
- 2. I hereby certify that every horse, rider and/or driver is eligible as entered and agree for myself and my representatives to be bound by the Constitution and rules of equestrian Canada and the Blue Sky Classic prize list at this competition. It is hereby recognized that all equestrian sports involve inherent risk and that no helmet or protective equipment can protect against all foreseeable injury. I hereby accept this risk and hold harmless EC, the competition, their officials, organizers, agents, employees, and their representatives. the person responsible (pr) agrees to the release of any information on the entry form to EC.
- 3. I certify that I am fully capable of participating in competition, schooling, and normal use of a horse. I assume and accept full responsibility for bodily injury, death, or loss of personal property and expenses because of those inherent risks, dangers and hazards identified herein, and those inherent risks, dangers and hazards not specifically identified herein.
- 4. In consideration of being allowed to participate in this event, I hereby irrevocably release and forever discharge Amberlea Meadows and L&S Classical events, their owners, employees, directors, shareholders, agents, representatives, volunteers, and sub-contractors, specifically including, but not limited to, Lynn Macyk, and Shannon Digweed, from all liability, claims, demands, damages, actions or causes of action arising or as might arise, present or future, whether known or unknown and whether
- in law or equity, in connection with or arising from my participation in the Blue Sky Classic Horse Show, including but not limited to bodily injury to myself or my horse(s) and damage to property arising from any cause whatsoever, including, but not limited to, the negligence of one or more of the individuals or organizations referred to herein.
- 5. I hereby declare that in signing the entry form document, that I have read and fully understand and agree to the terms and conditions stated herein and that it is binding upon my executors, heirs, administrators, and assigns.
- 6. All persons mounted on a horse are required to wear ATSM or BSI approved helmets.

An unlimited number of scholarships will be awarded to competitors in the CET Medal, CET Mini Medal, 1.10m Eclipse Medal, and 1.00m Eclipse Medal based off of scores earned. Riders who earn a combined score of minimum 156 out of a combined total of 200 in the CET Medal and 1.10m Eclipse Medal will receive a scholarship of \$115.00 at EC Gold Sanctioned tournaments. Riders who earn a combined score of minimum 156 out of a combined total of 200 in the CET Mini Medal and 1.00m Eclipse Medal will receive a scholarship of \$110.00.

EXAMPLE: A competitor earns a score of 76 in the CET Medal, and a score of 80 in the Eclipse Medal for a combined total of 156/200, a scholarship will be awarded.

If a competitor earns a score of 75 in the CET Medal and a score of 70 for a combined total of 145/200 in the Eclipse Medal, a scholarship will not be awarded.

The top 4 CET Medal riders at the Prairie Regional Finals will receive a guaranteed travel bursary of \$3,000. These riders, as well as the top 4 CET Mini Medal Prairie Region riders, will qualify to compete at Royal West in the \$12,000 Equitation Team Challenge against riders from the British Columbia region.


